Hope Kitchen SCIO	Argyll and Bute	£150,000	The group will run a recovery café which will support 225 people and 40 volunteers in the Oban area affected by homelessness, alcohol and drug addiction and mental health issues. The Recovery Café will be a three year project, to provide one to one support, peer support and sign post to specialist services. The café will be open one day per week with two full time staff, and will include home visits, with assessments in the morning and activities in the afternoon.
Community Alliance Trust Limited - Bob Giulianotti - 0131 468 1934	City of Edinburgh	£149,916	The project will bring the community together in Craigmillar, Edinburgh through community gardening and healthy eating. The activities will be based in three housing estates: Bingham, Niddrie Mill and Magdalene. The group will employ a community gardener who will work with local residents to investigate how local greenspaces can be better used for food growing, a natural play worker who will develop play opportunities and a community food worker to deliver healthy cooking workshops and classes.
Cre8te Opportunities Limited	City of Edinburgh	£131,336	The project will provide intensive one to one support, drop in sessions and bespoke counselling for female sex workers over a three year period. It will build their skills and confidence and will remove the barriers preventing them from moving on with their lives free from this dangerous and stigmatised industry.
Fischy Music	City of Edinburgh	£120,946	The group will run a three year project offering a range of musical activities to children aged between 9 and 12 years of age in Pilton and Muirhouse. Children will be able to take part in a 10 week song writing course and music making programme as well as attending a week long, music themed holiday club.
Gorgie City Farm	City of Edinburgh	£150,000	The group will be able to continue to run their free city farm, which is open to all members of the local community, seven days a week. They will also deliver learning, volunteering and leisure activities at the farm, helping the local community to learn about farming and food production.
Dumfries and Galloway Housing Partnership	Dumfries and Galloway	£448,525	The organisation seeks to continue their supported accommodation initiative for young care leavers aged 16-24 in Dumfries. The funding will allow the organisation to continue employing staff to work in partnership with the Local Authority to deliver activities that prepare young care leavers to sustain their own tenancy and to live independently in an area of their choice. Young people leaving care who have been identified as needing additional assistance will have access to emotional and practical support.
Art Angel - Rosalie Summerton - 01382228383	Dundee City	£119,416	The group will run a programme of art work to isolated people with mental health difficulties in Dundee. Over 70 people aged sixteen and over will be supported into exploring their artistic nature which will motivate, inspire and contribute to their recovery.
Boomerang Community Centre	Dundee City	£145,298	The group will be able to develop the services and facilities it currently runs, for the people living in the Stobswell area of Dundee. Recently the organisation has moved into new, larger premises, and this will allow them to expand the range of activities on offer, so that everyone in the local community will have a chance to be included. The centre will be able to increase its opening hours and local people will work with the staff in identifying the services and activities they want to be included.
Dundee and Angus ADHD Support Group SCIO	Dundee City	£98,796	The organisation currently runs a thriving support group for children with ADHD and their families. This includes three youth clubs, parenting support and general awareness raising of ADHD. They will be able to employ a Project Manager to run and develop their programme of activities.
Cyrenians	Edinburgh East	£499,927	The funding will enable the organisation to continue to deliver and develop their established amber mediation support services and conflict resolution workshops to young people and their families. The project will enable the continuation of the preventative and early intervention conflict resolution workshops in schools and youth settings. The workshops are targeted at young people aged 14 to 24 who have complex home lives or have anger management issues.
Creative Therapies	Glasgow Central	£276,138	The project will support children whose lives have been affected by substance abuse within the family and who are living in a kinship care arrangement. The project will also support kinship carers, many of whom are grandparents, aunts and uncles, to engage with parenting 'second time around' helping them develop/regain parenting skills whilst addressing the issues of becoming a kinship carer. This will be achieved through the provision a structured programme tailored to individual and family needs.
Licketyspit Limited	Glasgow City	£150,000	The project will provide drama-led play for children aged 3-9 and their families in the communities of Whiteinch, Ruchill and the Gorbals, in Glasgow. Over the next three years the group aim to work with 900 people will work in partnership with local community centres.

No Fear Community Interest Company	Glasgow City	£137,694	The group will work with men and women either receiving or perpetrating abuse. The aim of the programme is to provide education and awareness to both groups to stop the cycle of abuse in families and for individuals. Delivered by trained practitioners, participants will undertake the 'Freedom' programme which comprises of 3 courses: 1) Living with the Dominator, 2) Co-dependant No More and 3) Understanding Love addiction.
Scottish Throughcare and Aftercare Forum	Glasgow City	£112,618	The project will connect young care experienced people with each other to help encourage and enable them to remain in care longer, until they are ready to leave. The organisation will provide a platform for 100 young care experienced people to share their views and opinions, which will then be used to influence change and service delivery for future young people in care within East Ayrshire.
The Fostering Network	Glasgow City	£149,162	The project will improve the lives of children in foster care and the children of the foster parents by engaging 38 young people across Scotland in a range of play, drama and dance workshops, which will help them express their creativity and share their experiences of care as well as organising a series of consultations to help improve the stability of foster placements and create new resources.
Wallacewell Community Fellowship & Oasis	Glasgow North East	£145,411	The organisation provides a ranges of activities for the local community through their 'Loving our community to life' service. The activities for all age ranges include a Nurture group, a support group for mums, a kinship carers homework club, baby massage, a garden workshop, IT/Internet training, and activities for children.
Wild things Environmental Education in Action	Moray	£131,761	The project will bring together the community in Forres, Moray through play in green spaces, outdoor activities, conversation and 'green' exercise, nature walks and run a series of environment craft activities such as making willow baskets and bird feeders. Young people will plan and deliver activities which will allow older people to access the outdoors safely and will help other young people take part in outdoor activities.
Levenwick Village Club	Shetland Islands	£106,190	The group will develop their village hall and visitor campsite. They will also be able to employ a community development worker, who will establish a number of new groups for the local community including a Men's Shed, a fall prevention programme and a toddler and youth club. The project will involve 200 people over a five year period.
